## National Day of Remembrance for Indian Boarding Schools

**September 30, 2025** 

On September 30, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) observes the National Day of Remembrance for Indian Boarding Schools. This is a day to honor the lives, stories, and resilience of Indigenous peoples who endured the deep harm of the U.S. boarding school system. In this video, leaders from the Lower Susquehanna Synod reflect on the painful history of schools like the Carlisle Indian Industrial School, located in our synod, where many children were taken from their families and never returned home. We remember, we tell the truth, and we commit to supporting Indigenous communities in the ongoing work of healing and repair. On this day, we invite congregations and leaders across our synod to wear orange as a visible sign of solidarity and remembrance. Together, we live into our baptismal call to strive for justice and peace in all the earth.



## **LARC Day of Dialogue**

November 5, 2025, 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.

#### Lutheran-Anglican-Roman Catholic Day of Dialogue

The First Council of Nicæa met in 325AD to bring peace to the Church by teaching about Christ and by establishing a common date for Easter. It was the first large-scale gathering of Christian leaders. As we celebrate the 1,700th anniversary of the Council of Nicæa, this year's Lutheran-Anglican-Roman Catholic Dialogue will feature speakers to discuss the background of the Council, how it took the Christian faith to the culture of the time, how it

addressed Christian life, and the ongoing importance of the Creed for contemporary Churches. This event is sponsored by the Lower and Upper Susquehanna Synods, the Episcopal Diocese of Central Pennsylvania, and the Roman Catholic Diocese of Harrisburg.

The Rev. Jonathan Linman is Associate Pastor for Teaching, Faith Formation, and Spiritual Care at Faith-La Fe Lutheran Church in Central Phoenix, Arizona, where he is also one of the Ecumenical and Inter-Religious Representatives for the Grand Canyon Synod of the ELCA. Ecumenism has been a central feature of his ministry throughout his 35 years of leadership and service beginning with his first pastorate in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, where shared mission with neighboring parishes undergirded inner-city ministry. Pastor Linman also served in an ecumenical ministry as Professor of Ascetical Theology and Director of the Center for Christian Spirituality at The General Theological Seminary of the Episcopal Church in New York City. Coordinating ecumenical events was also a feature of his ministry while on staff of the Metropolitan New York Synod as Assistant to the Bishop for Faith and Leadership Formation. Pastor Linman was a member of Round XII of U.S. Lutheran-Catholic Dialogue, serves as Lutheran Co-Chair of the ELCA-United Methodist Church Full Communion Coordinating Committee, and most recently crafted the ELCA Study Guide on the Lutheran World Federation-Orthodox Church Joint Statement on the Filioque.

#### **Time to Update Your Constitution**

The Churchwide Assembly approved changes to the ELCA Model Constitution for Congregations. **Every congregation now needs to update its constitution to align with the 2025 model constitution** (ELCA, 2025).

Start by downloading the updated model on the ELCA website.

- Review the required and recommended provisions.
- Mark your edits in a clean, easy-to-read draft.
- Send that draft and a copy of the Constitution you are updating to Cindy Kelbaugh, Synod Secretary, for a quick compliance review at ckelbaugh@lss-elca.org. Secretary Kelbaugh will have the Congregation Constitution Review team take a look at it and let you know if there is anything that needs your attention before you proceed.

After the administrative review, **bring the constitution to your congregation for a vote** according to your current constitutional procedures.

This process protects your governance, clarifies roles, and keeps your ministry aligned with current churchwide standards. If you have questions, check out the **Synod webpage on Governing Documents** or contact Secretary Cindy Kelbaugh at **ckelbaugh@lss-elca.org**.
