

As we begin preparing for this year's Synod Assembly, to be held at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in York on Friday, June 5, and Saturday, June 6, 2026, we encourage congregations to begin identifying their lay voting members. To assist with that planning, we want to share the tentative assembly schedule: Friday, June 5, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and Saturday, June 6, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. We hope this information is helpful as you consider availability and participation when selecting voting members.

Synod Council will consider the proposed rules of procedure, agenda, and registration rates at its January 31 meeting. Once action is taken on these items, additional details will be shared.



LAMPA Isaiah 58:12 Fellowship

Empowering Lutheran Youth in Pennsylvania for Racial Reconciliation

Youth and young adults can apply for a grant of up to \$500 for projects in their congregation or community to further racial justice and reconciliation and a \$1,000 scholarship upon successful completion of the project.

Building on the prophet Isaiah's vision of those who "will be called repairer of the breach, restorer of the streets to live in," this fellowship empowers recipients to address racial injustice and enact reconciliation at the grassroots level. Up to 3 fellowships will be awarded each year.

- Each recipient is paired with a clergyperson of color to serve as mentor to bring the project to fruition.
- Monthly check-ins with mentors and LAMPA staff, and participation in antiracism training are required parts of the fellowship.
- Fellows will present on their project and fellowship experience at Lutheran Day 2026 (April 21, 2026).
- Fellows who successfully complete their projects will then receive \$1,000 for college tuition or continuing education.

Winterfest 2026: Better Together Recap

What does it mean to be *Better Together*, to be united by our common bond as beloved children of God, gathered around our Lord's table and sent into the world as one body in Christ? For more than 260 high school youth, young adults, and congregation advisors from over 35 congregations who gathered for Winterfest 2026, they spent the first weekend in January answering just that question. Under the theme of *Better Together*, participants explored the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s vision of beloved community, reflected on what it means to belong to one another in Christ, and how to put our faith into action. Winterfest-goers had a chance to live out the promise of *Better Together* through a food-packing project held during the event, packing over 30,000 meals in partnership with Rise Against Hunger.

Wrapped in Love

A Thank You to Our Blanket Makers

Thank you to all of our congregations and individuals who lovingly and thoughtfully made blankets for the December 21 Homeless Memorial Blanket Initiative. This year marked our fifth year participating in and supporting the Homeless Memorial Blanket Initiative, and it is clear that this is and always will be more than a single annual day. It has become a movement. A witness. A collective refusal to forget those whom the world too often overlooks.

Each blanket you knit, crocheted, stitched, tied, and prayed over became part of something much bigger than fabric and thread. Your blankets traveled to Denver, Colorado, offering warmth to bodies and to hearts to say clearly and compassionately: *you are seen, you are remembered, you matter.*

On the longest night of the year, the day culminated in Denver's "We Will Remember" Homeless Vigil, where 274 lives lost to homelessness were named and honored. As reported by *The Denver Voice*, the vigil gathered community members in candlelight and prayer, holding sacred space for grief, dignity, and remembrance with each name spoken aloud, each life honored as beloved.

Your blankets were part of that holy witness, surrounding the vigil with tangible care and compassion. Thank you for showing up with your hands, your time, your prayers, and your love. Thank you for helping us remember. Thank you for helping us bear hope into the cold.

And this movement continues. We invite you to keep the blankets coming, because next year our blankets will travel to New York, where they will once

again wrap remembrance, dignity, and compassion around lives too often forgotten.
